1. Dr. Lipitz received her undergraduate and Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine degrees from this University.
3. Pets with this disease walk as if they are drunk because they side step, lean, or stumble to one side.
4. An involuntary, rapid and repetitive movement of the eyes—either horizontal (side-to-side), vertical (up and down) or rotary circular).
5. Signs of this disease are pain caused by stretching of the nerve roots and spinal cord lining and weakness and decreased proprioception which occur as compression inhibits signals between the brain and limbs.
